

Planetary Peace Movement Core Principles

7. Problems Should Be Solved Locally First

Governance should occur at the lowest effective level, with planetary institutions addressing only what cannot be solved locally or nationally.

8. Planetary Governance Must Be Democratic

Any future planetary authority must be based on free elections, human rights, and a shared planetary constitution.

9. The United Nations Is Not Enough

The current UN structure cannot prevent war or mass suffering. New planetary institutions must eventually emerge.

10. Our Goal Is the Prevention of Unnecessary Death

War, hunger, disease, pollution, and corruption are solvable problems. We must choose to solve them.
