### **A Democratic Vision for a Just and Peaceful World**

#### **1. The Problem We Face**

Global power functions without democratic oversight.

Wealthy individuals, corporations, and financial networks can move across borders, often avoiding the laws, taxes, and responsibilities that ordinary people must follow.

Investigations like the Panama Papers revealed systems that allow the powerful to operate by a different set of rules.

This creates a dangerous imbalance:

#### **2. What PFJF Is Not**

PFJF rejects the idea of a centralized, authoritarian “one world government.”

We do **not** seek:

- A single ideology imposed on all people

We recognize the legitimate fear that large, distant institutions can become unaccountable.

#### **3. What PFJF Does Propose**

PFJF envisions a **democratic federal system for the planet**, built from the ground up—not imposed from the top down.

This system would:

### **Guarantee Universal Human Rights**

A binding global constitution ensuring that every human being—regardless of nationality—has fundamental rights protected.

### **Preserve National Sovereignty—With Limits**

Nations remain self-governing in culture, economy, and local law, but **lose the “right” to wage war or violate basic human rights.**

### **Create Democratic Global Institutions**

Global bodies would be:

- Elected or accountable to the people
- Transparent in their decisions
- Limited in scope and power

This idea builds on principles seen in systems like the United States Constitution, but adapted for a diverse and interconnected world.

## **4. Limiting the Power of the Rich and Powerful**

PFJF directly addresses systemic inequality and corruption.

We support:

- **Global anti-corruption laws** that apply equally to all
- **Coordinated tax standards** to prevent offshore avoidance
- **Transparency requirements** for wealth, lobbying, and political funding
- **Equal access to justice**, regardless of wealth or status

No individual or corporation should operate above the law—anywhere on Earth.

## **5. Ending Violence as a Political Tool**

PFJF is committed to nonviolence.

We propose:

- National defense forces strictly limited to self-defense

- A **democratically accountable global peacekeeping force** to prevent genocide, aggression, and unlawful violence
- The elimination of war as an accepted instrument of policy

## 6. A Decentralized, Layered Democracy

To address fears of overreach, PFJF supports a **layered system of governance**:

- **Local** – Communities govern themselves
- **National** – Countries retain identity and autonomy
- **Global** – Limited authority to protect rights, prevent war, and ensure fairness

Power flows **upward from the people**, not downward from elites.

## 7. Why This Matters

The choice is not between “globalism” and “nationalism.”

The real choice is:

- **Unregulated global power** serving the few  
or
- **Democratic global accountability** serving everyone

PFJF stands for a world where:
