What Is the PFJF Movement?

The Peace, Freedom, Justice, and Fairness (PFJF) Movement is a peaceful, nonviolent, planetary movement dedicated to advancing human dignity, democratic governance, human rights, and global cooperation.

The movement exists because many of humanity's greatest problems now transcend national borders and cannot be effectively solved by isolated nation-states acting alone.

These problems include:

- War and genocide
- Political corruption
- Hunger and preventable disease
- Environmental destruction
- Human trafficking and slavery
- Censorship and authoritarianism
- Nuclear weapons
- Massive economic inequality
- Attacks on democratic institutions

Core Beliefs

The PFJF Movement is based on several core principles:

1. Every human life is equal and invaluable.
2. Human life is sacred and should be protected.
3. Governments derive legitimacy from the consent of the governed.
4. Human rights belong to every person.
5. Peaceful democratic reform is preferable to violence.
6. Free speech and freedom of belief are essential.
7. Corruption undermines justice and democracy.
8. Humanity shares a common future.

9. Science and truth should guide policy.
10. Future generations deserve a livable planet.

Goals of the Movement

The movement seeks to:

- Reduce and ultimately eliminate war.
- Prevent genocide and crimes against humanity.
- Protect human rights globally.
- Promote free and fair elections.
- Reduce corruption at all levels of government.
- Expand access to education and information.
- Protect freedom of belief and expression.
- Prevent needless human suffering.
- Encourage democratic planetary cooperation.

Organizational Principles

The PFJF Movement is intended to be:

- Nonviolent
- Democratic
- Inclusive
- Decentralized
- Transparent
- International
- Voluntary

There are:

- No membership fees.
- No required ideology beyond support for core principles.
- No requirement to abandon existing political or religious beliefs.

People from all nations, cultures, religions, and philosophical traditions are welcome.

- Civic engagement
- Nonviolent activism
- International dialogue
- Constitutional reform

Long-Term Vision

The movement does not seek authoritarian global control. It supports accountable, constitutional, democratic cooperation between peoples and nations.
