1. PEACE

Definition in PFJF:

Minimizing violence, insecurity, fear, and instability in people's lives.

Government Services That Support Peace:

- Universal healthcare
- Strong social safety nets
- Public safety systems focused on trust and de-escalation
- Mental health services
- Stable housing policies

Why This Matters:

When people are not afraid of:

- getting sick and going bankrupt
- losing their home
- falling into extreme poverty

 society becomes inherently more peaceful.

PFJF Insight:

Peace is not just the absence of war—it is the absence of constant survival anxiety.

2. FREEDOM

Definition in PFJF:

The real ability to make meaningful life choices—not just theoretical rights.

Government Services That Enable Freedom:

- Free education and lifelong learning
- Childcare support
- Paid parental leave
- Income support during unemployment
- Digital access to government services

Why This Matters:

Without support, people are “free” in name only.

👉 A person working 3 jobs just to survive is not meaningfully free.

PFJF Insight:

Freedom increases when people have:

- time
- health
- education
- economic stability

➡ These systems convert formal rights into real freedom.

3. JUSTICE

Definition in PFJF:

Fair and equal treatment, protection of rights, and equitable systems.

Government Services That Support Justice:

- Universal access to healthcare and education
- Low-cost legal systems
- Transparent governance
- Anti-corruption systems
- Fair labor protections

Why This Matters:

Justice is undermined when outcomes depend on:

- wealth
- status
- connections

👉 In the happiest countries, systems are designed to reduce those disparities.

PFJF Insight:

Justice is not just legal—it is systemic fairness in daily life.

 4. FAIRNESS

Definition in PFJF:

Equitable distribution of resources, opportunities, and responsibilities.

Government Services That Support Fairness:

- Progressive taxation
- Child allowances
- Public pensions
- Housing support
- Equal access to public services

Why This Matters:

Extreme inequality erodes social trust and cohesion.

👉 These countries actively redistribute resources to maintain balance.

PFJF Insight:

Fairness does not mean everyone gets the same—it means:

- everyone gets what they need to live with dignity

- no one is left behind
