Instead, we propose:

Transparency Instead of Secrecy

Power should be visible, understandable, and open to public scrutiny.

Accountability Instead of Immunity

No individual, corporation, or government should operate above the law.

Democracy Instead of Control

Authority must come from the consent of the people—not from wealth, force, or influence.

The Real Question Is Not “Global vs National”

The real questions are:

- Who holds power?
- How transparent is that power?
- Who has the ability to challenge or change it?

PFJF focuses on these questions rather than labels.

A Different Model: Layered, Democratic Governance

Rather than replacing nations with a single centralized authority, PFJF supports a **layered system of governance**:

- **Local governance** remains closest to the people
- **National governments** continue to manage domestic affairs
- **Planetary frameworks** address issues that cross borders

This ensures that decisions are made at the **appropriate level**, not imposed from above.
